From Slip to Chip












As this Instagram story tells, the choice of Sweet Potatoes for school gardens is because of their excellent timing. Plant in June, water well, leave for the summer, harvest in October! They are very cross-cultural. The slips were grown in Ontario, even though this is a tropical plant usually sourced by farmers from the USA. Vineland Research Station developed this Ontario variety called Radiance.
